It's a gift to future generations who will look back on us with gratitude and pride. We can and must do better by our National Forest."

Extensive, roadless areas are rare in Vermont. They help mitigate climate change and serve as refuge for rare species. When older growth in higher elevations is cut, invasive species move in. The benefits to any creation of early successional habitat are only temporary; in the longterm, there is great imbalance.
