Comments: 45-Day Comment Period Extension Request re: Draft Assessment of the Tongass NationalForest Land Management Plan #64039Dear Ms. Mathews, On behalf of Defenders of Wildlife, Center for Biological Diversity, Southeast AlaskaConservation Council - SEACC, The Wilderness Society, Sierra Club, Earth Justice, AlaskaWilderness League, Natural Resources Defense Council, and Women's Earth and ClimateAction Network, and our millions of members and supporters, we respectfully request a45-day extension of the public comment period to 90 days for the Draft Assessment of the Tongass National Forest Management Plan.1The assessment is a crucial step in the forest plan revision process, as it provides thebaseline of existing ecological, economic, and social conditions and trends on the forest;the assessment must be informed by the best available science. The assessment willinform development of the new forest plan, which will ultimately provide guidance fordecision making across the entire Tongass Forest for at least the next 15 years. The rules that govern forest planning make strong commitments to involve the publicthroughout the planning process. The current 45-day comment period for the Draft Assessment is not enough time forthe public to meaningfully review and engage at this important stage. In the ongoing BlueMountains Forest Plan Revision process, the Forest Service recently provided a 60daycomment period on the Draft Assessment reports published in spring 2024.2 The Tongass is the largest national forest in the U.S., at 17 million acres, whereas the Blue MountainsNational Forest, by comparison, is only 5.5 million acres. The Blue Mountains DraftAssessment reports totaled 752 pages and Tongass reports comprise 826 pages. A 90-daypublic comment period is appropriate and necessary for the Tongass Draft Assessment considering the significance of the assessment to the forest planning process on thenation's largest national forest. The public and our members need ample time to review the extensive Draft Assessment inorder to fully comment on the high-level concepts and statements as well as identify any factual corrections, supplemental data sources, and necessary additions. For these reasons, and to ensure the public has the best opportunity to meaningfully engage in theplanning process and develop thoughtful comments for the Tongass Forest PlanAssessment, we request a 45-day comment period extension of the current 45-daycomment period, with a new deadline of until April 10, 2025.
