Please consider the following thoughts on issues that I do not see adequately addressed in this Draft Assessment. I include recent sources that deserve to be meaningfully integrated in Tongass Land Management Plan.

1. The Tongass is an Indigenous place of global significance, and clear, enduring protections for old growth forests, roadless areas, and biodiversity should be prioritized.

The islands of the Tongass support a disproportionate number of endemic taxa compared to other high-latitude terrestrial ecosystems, and the Species of Concern Draft List is missing several mammals worthy of inclusion (Androski et al, 2024). The ecology of the Tongass is increasingly vulnerable to climate change and anthropogenic activity, and revisions of the Tongass Land Management Plan need much stronger commitments to the documentation and protection of its biodiversity, especially its endemic and understudied species.
