I think the Forest Service is heading in the right direction with the draft assessment that highlights Alaskans' interest in the uniqueness of our remote forested island archipelago, the importance of the Forest as homelands to Native Alaskans, for customary and traditional uses, for salmon, and for hunting, fishing, and outdoor recreation.
