As your literature says, our environment is changing and it's appropriate that our land managers are updating their plans, in keeping with original goals of these plans. The Northwest Forest Plan's central goal is to protect endangered species.

Your proposals lead with the timber-industry scare tactic of "wildfires" and understates the role of community hardening and forests that are needed to sequester and store atmospheric carbon to mitigate the existential crisis we face with an overheating planet.

Plans to double or triple logging in the name of community safety is not backed up by scientific analysis and dramatically degrades biodiversity, water and air quality, and wildlife habitat.
