The proposed changes would weaken core environmental protections for our forests and create loopholes to allow logging in places meant to protect wildlife.

Our national forests are not a crop to be salvage logged or clear cut without very very careful attention to the environmental impacts of the logging, roads, and removal of old growth forest. Allowing more than 800,000 acres to be logged in these 17 national forests would further threaten wildlife, negatively impact water quality and fisheries, and destroy some of our country's oldest stands of trees.
