Comments: The DEIS proposes increased timber harvest will sustain local communities but evidence says profit goes to large companies outside of the region.

The NWFP divides forests into wet or dry regions, this is inadequate. Judgements are being passed using binary, broad brush assessments but these forests require more intricate assessments to truly work with, and protect them.
