Our forest plan must protect imperiled species and biodiversity. Conservation measures that prioritize habitat for Salmon, Spotted Owl, Marbled Murrelet, and the myriad other species that make our forests vibrant and unique must remain at the heart of any NW forest plan update.

Our forests are an absolutely integral component of our life and culture in the Pacific Northwest.

We must honor and protect what we have.

Future generations are depending on us to do the right thing!

Our forests belong to the people of the PNW, and decisions about their use and management should be made by and FOR the people, not for private industries looking to increase harvest and profit.
