RE: NorthWest Forest Plan Amendment #64745

- 1 - Do amend all forest above 5,000 feet elevation be considered moist forest
- 2 - Do amend the 30 yr. old NWFP to incorporate new scientific climate change data
- 3 - Do amend, analyze and recognize the klamath-siskiyou mixed tree species severity fire regime to be treated sites specific to each watershed.
- 4 - Do amend and give priority to non-commercial fuels management close to rural homes and community. Include public meetings again with local CAC's. For example, the Williams Oregon "Citizen Advisory Council" are elected officials whom collaborate with our Josephine County planning department.
- 5 - Do amend and limit in our dry south west Oregon forest a logging tree cut size DBH limit of 21" inches. Do amend and keep a 80 year old tree age limit for commercial logging.
- 6 - Do amend and stop all salvage logging in LSR's, in Late Successional Reserves.
7. - Do amend and include analysis in the forest service DEIS for post-fire foraging for the Northern Spotted Owl. As a BLM employee for 6 years working as a bio-tech, I witnessed the STOC coming back to the burnt nest tree and forage.
- 8 - Do amend and keep the NEPA act active in every management plan and project in the NWFP.
- 9 - Do amend where our neighbors are cutting down their forest and recognize and analyze the "Connectivity" of wildlife trails in the NWFP to leave intact migration trails for wildlife habitat.
- 10 - Do amend the NWFP to exclude old-growth forest logging and include surveys of threatened and endangered plant and animal species. Keep 120 foot buffer from all creeks and rivers.
11. - Do amend and include tribal native American's in supporting their logging methods and fuels management methods.
