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Comments: I pass the entrance to Log Canyon daily. This problem spot is a few miles from my home.

Historically there has been an approximately 1-2 acre of parking at the mouth of Log Canyon. Until this last year the landowner did not have fencing along hwy 132 or along the entrance of Log Canyon road. Lack of fencing made for a natural parking area for trucks, trailers, OHV's, camp trailers etc. In the landowners defense--The parking lot has continued to increase and encroach on their property. Since the installation of fencing, vehicles are parked inside the narrow right of way 1 lane road. I have personally watched traffic jams and angry situations evolve. This issue presents a serious public safety challenge because there is no place for the public to turn around and exit Log Canyon Road. Once committed up the road, the only way out is to back the vehicle & trailers onto hwy 132 (while others are waiting) and onto the 65 MPH highway. With the lack of parking, many vehicles are now being parked within the hwy 132 frontage. Camp trailers, OHV's etc.

At minimum, a sign should indicate that there is no place to turn around for 4-5 miles if you choose to enter log canyon road. As a landowner, I understand the right to fence ones private property. To prevent public safety issues and provide access, a solution to purchase 2 acres for a parking lot and turn around area is needed.
