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Comments: The area under discussion was severely affected by the Dixie Fire and is a sad shadow of its former self. Natural rehabilitation will occur, but over an exceptionally long time frame. This necessitates significant forest management intervention. Planting a variety of tree species is essential to prevent a mono-culture recovered forest. Stream corridors need to be rehabilitated to prevent accelerated erosion and siltation in support of recovering fish and other aquatic species. All dead trees with merchantable value should be harvested. No living trees should be harvested. Native grass and wildflower seeds should be widely sown to accelerate recovery. Any roads that are created to accomplish the above need to be de-commissioned and removed upon completion of the project.
