Granting the additional crazy horse lift as well as allowing for a lift and extension of trails on the north end of the "Blackfoot" zone in terrain already occupied as cross country terrain makes sense for all. I would also approve expansion of a summer bike/hike trail network within the current resort boundary. There is so little public land left in this country that the loss of any of it would be hugely detrimental to wildlife as well as humans. Some stipulation should be placed on any approval that would benefit teton valley idaho as opposed to just lining the pockets of teton valley Wyoming already one of the wealthiest counties in the country.
