I know that this project was not brought forth by the Forest Service and I understand that due process has to be followed, but if the Rochford Mineral Exploratory Drilling Project is passed without further environmental assessments conducted and without more consideration for the Lakota People, it doesn't seem like you are 'Caring for the Land and Serving the People' like your tagline says you are.
