I/we must note again, the destruction of 8,000 acres of unspoiled habitat, particularly in that location, beggars the imagination. The Reservoir & Damp; creek, as you know, are surrounded by forest - the area in question travels away from the watershed and creek to our backyard. Unless the forest around the lake and the creek is 'thoroughly husked' there is no true protection. This seems to most, an exercise in futility. Why is it being so earnestly pursued?
