Thank you for the opportunity to provide comment on the Grand Targhee Resort (GTR) On-mountain Master Plan Proposal. I absolutely support all of the identified improvements as laid out in their plan. The ski area definitely needs several improvements-adding new terrain, increasing on-site dining options, upgrading current and new lifts, improving snowmaking, and adding summer recreation options. The approval of the Master plan will go a long way in modernizing the resort and providing an overall better "user experience", for both winter and summer seasons.

Further, as one of the largest employers in the region, Grand Targhee's future plans will have a direct and positive impact to the local economy. You would expect to increase job opportunities for the local community, while also increasing the tax base and providing needed resources for the counties in both Wyoming and Idaho. Indeed, local businesses throughout the Teton Valley each year would gain a larger and enriched customer base to draw from into the foreseeable future.

I am sure there will be "naysayers" that will point out numerous concerns and question the need for this, as they did a couple of years ago; however, don't be dissuaded. I can imagine there will be concern regarding, increased traffic, crowded parking lots, more lights on the hill (really?), long lift lines, and crowds everywhere. This is simply inaccurate, and at best, an unsubstantiated conspiracy theory. There should be no expectation that the resort expansion will create overwhelming crowds affecting the local community..."if you build it, they will come" is simply not a viable objection to this project.
