P 341 of DEIS states "the other threat to water quality is nutrient loading and contamination to the nearby pubic water system from the proposed wastewater treatment for on-mountain facilities.

Page 70 of the DEIS incorrectly states that the Mono Tree Area is not considered a hiking area. It continues by saying it is not a popular recreation site. This is ABSOLUTELY UNTRUE.
