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Comments: Please see the following excerpt from page 43. This statement is based on a false and antiquated view of energy production and is potentially detrimental to Wyoming small businesses, operating commercially on public lands. The current administration has eliminated tax incentives and mandates for EV's, based on reasons which should also discourage such misleading promotions by USFS. The notion that Lithium batteries and their associated international surface mining, are somehow more environmentally friendly, than Wyoming's coal, oil and gas is a direct assault on Wyoming's economy.

3. Electric technology will blur the line between motorized and non-motorized use. Electric vehicles offer new opportunities for some people, obvious benefits for the climate, and can reduce noise and odor, but the technology comes with growing pressure on managers to provide areas where these uses are appropriate and can be accommodated.

If the statement "blur the line" is pretext to permitting electrically mechanized vehicles to access Wilderness Areas, ACEC's, WSA's, roadless areas and USFS trails where horses are utilized for transportation, then we appreciate your prompt withdrawal of this statement and its initiative from the draft plan.
