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Comments: With the present drought (and continuing to look as though it will become the "new norm" ) I feel that livestock grazing isn't being addressed at its true impact on other forest resources. The upper green river grazing association states they don't feel they are over grazing the allotment, what a laugh. The association is a profit based group of businesses that wish to pluck on our heart strings invoking a vision of the Wild West and the permit holding family's and corporations that only desire cheap grass at the expense of the native flora and fauna.

As with the grazers the outfitting industry seeks only financial advantage at the cost of the general hunting public. Their advantages are numerous, with no limit stays, no other camp's within a quarter mile, making permanent camps, spike camps and mostly the majority's attitude that the general public is costing them money. I believe that in the management plan outfitter's permits should go up for bid every 10 years. This would enable young people to enter the industry and not give the present lease holds a license to steal from those who want to enter the industry.

With the increasing effect's global warming is having it is critical the management plan lean heavily on the best science available. This cannot be over emphasized. As well as fairness to the non-business public who contribute more money to the forest service than for profit users.
