Comments: To Bridger-Teton Forest Service Planning Managers,

In reply to comment request regarding the Draft Assessment of the Bridger-Teton Forest Planning, I would like to share some thoughts.

My view would be for the Forest Service Management to promote appreciation and respect for the forest system and to teach users to tread lightly. Whenever possible, manage the forest to mimic the natural cycle of the forest system. Be proactive in assessing potential impacts of new outdoor recreational products such as electric bikes, trends and technological advances. Prioritize protecting water sheds, wildlife birthing (nursery habitat), winter range and places where roads and all-terrain vehicles don't go. Post signs at Forest access points which include area maps, allowed uses and information for violation punishments. (We have seen major access points in Bondurant have no signs for years and finally there is a new sign, but it has none of these things. Therefore, it is easy to plead ignorance for violations.)
