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Comments: This proposal breaks my heart. As a resident of Summit County, I respect and appreciate the need to mitigate parking and traffic issues caused by individuals who are unable to respect a TH being too full to hike. The Spruce Creek TH is my back yard - I have witnessed parking overflow on the road first hand many times. While I wholeheartedly agree with the need to enforce rules against parking on county roads, I do not and can not agree to restricting access to these areas even more than they already have been restricted by requiring paid reservations. In any given season, I hike Monte Cristo Gulch (Blue Lakes TH), Fletcher Mountain (Blue Lakes TH), Quandary West Ridge (Blue Lakes TH), Spruce Creek Loop (Spruce Creek TH), Father Dyer + Crystal Peak (Spruce Creek TH) dozens of times. I would be able to say the same of McCollough Gulch and the accessible 13ers from this trail (Pacific & Atlantic Peaks) if not for the already existent restrictions at this TH for parking that prevents me from freely doing so. It is already frustrating enough to have lost easy access to McCollough Gulch & Quandary Peak TH (which, as a local, I'm inclined to visit on a quiet weekday regardless). Please find another solution for these other TH - better signage about not parking beyond the lot proper, weekend ticketing enforcement, paid shuttle services from TOB (we need a better and more reliable commuter service to/from Blue River as it is - maybe it's time to make these solutions go hand in hand!). Please DO NOT add Blue Lakes and Spruce Creek to this prohibitive permit program. You will be inadvertently removing access to individuals who live, work, and contribute to the community and value these beautiful trails, beloved 13ers, and popular alpine lakes for fly fishing, etc. Parking permits and "paying to play" are NOT the answers.
