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Comments: Some additional comments:

Do not create burn piles in meadows. They have a lot of organic matter in soil, and may continue burning a long time.

Keep salt blocks off of lava caps. The plants there already cope with less snow pack and more water stress. Do not add the stress of salt to those thin soils.

On the 108 corridor, *Perideridia bacigalupi* was mapped on meta-sedimentary ridges long ago. With deep tilling on some of those ridges and lack of maintenance as fuelbreaks, they became too shady for it and it persisted along road cuts. There may be this species or other species that need opening that may move onto the fuelbreaks and then be eliminated by management activities. This could act like a sink that could affect viability.

I hope weeds will be a priority on fuelbreaks. Both wind and gravity can spread them greatly from there.
