Commercial and Recreational Aviation have used the airstrips within the Blue Mountains Forests since the 1930's. Let's ensure future aviators have the same access as their predecessors by ensuring aviation activities are allowed on these public lands and clearly stated in the new Land Management Plan.

Further these kind of airstrips are often managed and taken care of by Aviation Organizations outside of the US Forest Service. This allows USFS funds to be allocated to other projects.
