I realize that the current administration has made even the pretense of good intention completely unnecessary, but we cannot turn the forests over to the timber industry for one last cash grab before our climate totally collapses and is no longer able to sustain forests where they currently exist. I am not opposed to any logging happening whatsoever on public lands, but going back to the good old days under the guise of "scientific" management for reducing wildfire risk is not the answer.
