Comments: As a 60+ year resident of Colorado, I've spent countless hours exploring the forests of Colorado. I'm writing today to ask that you stop destroying (logging/burning) our National Forests. The area beyond the Sunlight ski area is pristine. I'm surprised it's never received a protected land status, however given the administrations dismantling of protections for our public lands - this seems a time to exploit the resources. The cost of 'reconstructing' roads, the destruction of the environment by logging machinery and the reduced access are all reasons to reconsider this 'land management' proposal. I would also think the ranchers that lease this area for their summer cattle grazing will be greatly impacted. Perhaps rather than destroying the forest you could spend time 'studying' the impact of class1 ebikes (which the state parks department have proved do not have impact) and allowing class1 ebikes in the White River National forest districts. I imagine all NF employees are also users in some form (hunting, camping, fishing, recreating) of these forests - do you really want to cut all the trees under the guise of 'land management'?
