Proactive management is drastically needed across all lands managed by the USFS. 40 years of a "hands off" approach has led to millions of acres across the west being lost to catastrophic fire. This lack of action has decimated wildlife, watersheds, environmental treasures, industries, and local communities. Pace and scale of active management needs to increase substantially, or we will risk losing the Stanislaus National Forest as a forested land scape just like the the Sierra, Sequoia, and Mendicino National Forest. My main concern in the project is the use of arbitrary tree size diameter limits. Diameter limits have no scientific or silvicultural basis and should have no basis on any management decision. Condition and site specifics should take precedent when it comes to management decisions. Arbitrary diameter limits will impede these projects and you will not be able to attain the over all goals if diameter limits are present. It is time to do what is right for the forest.
