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Comments: After witnessing the devastation in Southern Oregon where BLM's recent logging practices have occurred, it is apparent that there is NO benefit to the community, forest, wildlife or for wildfire mitigation.

What they have Actually done is to increase fire danger and massively damage the entire ecosystem by OVER CUTTING the Douglas Fir, and other trees as well - the Oaks, the Madrones and Ponderosa Pine. Essentially leaving hillsides of dry dirt and flammable debris where our thriving public forests have been for many, many years.

My concern is since aggressive logging is already happening with BLM and it is so drastically shocking to our ecosystem, by creating more logging areas is adding fuel to the fire, so to speak, by increasing wildfire conditions and destroying the ecosystem of this valley. I ask you to look at postponing your logging proposal to allow time for our valley to recover from this initial shock and devastation. Also to limit your logging and to be prepared to have strict oversight on your logging projects to make sure that only proposed trees be harvested and not to allow the logging companies to harvest hard woods for their convenience and personal profit. By keeping a large percentage of high canopy trees it keeps the understory from volatile undergrowth, this keeps our community safer, better ground moisture, and a more natural ecosystem. Please scrutinize your decisions. There is no changing this large of a mistake. You only have today to make the best choices for our land and environmental health.
