I object to thinning 1,735 acres of Douglas-fir plantations in the Willamette National Forest without adequate public scrutiny of how this timber harvest affects the broader Middle Fork Ranger District ecosystem.

The Dead Mountain project combines logging, fuels reduction, and prescribed fire across hundreds of acres in Lane County, Oregon, and I urge the Forest Service to ensure each of these distinct activities receives thorough separate analysis under NEPA.

Building 2 miles of new trail as part of this project expands permanent infrastructure on National Forest System lands and I want the Forest Service to fully evaluate long-term recreation impacts before approving that construction.

The scale of prescribed fire and fuels reduction proposed here needs a stronger justification, and I urge the Forest Service to document why this level of burning and thinning is warranted across the Middle Fork Ranger District.
