Comments: I oppose this action as proposed.

I oppose using emergency authority to give companies more timber, waiving the normal pre-decisional objection process for the Blue Moon Forest Restoration and Fuels Project, because that process is the public's main check on whether or not their land becomes part of Secretary of the Interior Doug Burgum's "Balance Sheet", specifically Compartments 23 and 69.

Do not bypass the standard objection process for 729 acres of pine in the Osceola National Forest; Secretary of Agriculture Brooke Rollins' timber demands should not substitute for full public review of logging and fuels treatments, not just in Florida, but nationwide. Public comments are currently the only way for the public to influence this logging decision, since emergency authority is being used to bypass the standard objection process, because the Forest Service and USDA are led by people who are trying to give endless amounts of protected lands to timber companies and other financial interests without any public or legal scrutiny. Don't increase logging in Osceola National Forest.
