Comments: I hike, mt bike, xc ski and swim in the Willamette National Forest. I oppose this action as proposed, and I ask the agency to weigh the specific harms below.

Table 11 lists five other reasonably foreseeable timber projects on the District (Fall Creek, Station Butte, Youngs Rock Rigdon, Steeple Rock Rigdon, and Cedar Creek Fire hazard tree removal) that substantially overlap in time with Dead Mountain, several beginning harvest in the same 2026-2029 window, totaling 333 MMBF through 2035. The cumulative effects discussion does not analyze whether concurrent harvest from all these projects would exceed the District's own stated typical sustainable annual output of roughly 32 to 40 MMBF per year (50 percent of the Forest's 65-80 MMBF). The agency should provide a year-by-year cumulative harvest volume analysis across these overlapping projects to demonstrate the combined harvest remains within sustainable bounds.
