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Comments: The Blue Mountains Forest Revision Plan calls for a 244% increase in mean annual timber volume, resulting in road use and reconstruction that will deliver sediment to streams with sensitive aquatic species. Increased sediment reduces egg-to-fry survival and disrupts food webs that support endangered species of Chinook, steelhead and bull Trout in our National Forest headwater systems . These populations are struggling to hold on to existence.

This is one reason I oppose the Blue Mountains Forest Revision Plan.

I do not want more roads in these forests. Besides the sediment in streams, the roads destroy the natural pathways for elk and other animals to go from one feeding area to another.
