Comments: Protect Idaho's "Big Wild," Adopt New Citizen Proposal

Dear Forest Plan Revision Officials,

The Founders of our Constitution intended for Congress to set policy for our international trade agreements. Fast Track legislation for presidential trade negotiating authority would turn the Constitution upside down and effectively delegate these congressional prerogatives to the Executive and to a U.S. Trade Representative's office that has been captured by Wall Street and international corporations.

Please reject any Fast Track trade bill that has not been revised top to bottom in a way that preserves congressional authority, Congress must retain authority over our nation's trade agenda, particularly when you may soon be asked to vote on a Trans Pacific Partnership trade deal that ignores the interests of domestic firms, workers, family farmers, and the environment. U.S. Trade Representative, Ambassador Mike Froman has been listening to his old colleagues on Wall Street and in the boardrooms of international corporations that care little about American prosperity and even less about working families and the environment.

At stake is Congress' constitutional authority to represent our interests. We sent you to Washington to stand up for us, not to give away your authority.

Please reject any attempt to establish Fast Track Trade Authority on the current model and oppose the Trans Pacific Partnership trade agreement.
