

Written Comment for the Incline Management Plan: We welcome and invite your written comments and input regarding the management of 1,138 acres of National Forest System lands off the Mt. Rose Highway (SR 431) above Incline Village, Nevada. The planning effort proposes project-specific activities to establish National Forest System standards for streams and habitat, recreation, road and trail management under the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit (LTBMU) Land Management Plan. The project also proposes a Forest Plan amendment to modify a portion of the project area from a general conservation management area to a backcountry management area. Please be sure to include your name and address. Your comments will be most helpful if they are specific as possible, telling us what you like or do not like and why. **Comments are due by the close of business on January 5, 2018.**

Generally, I like the plan for summer recreation, particularly adopting existing trails to form a loop. I am concerned that mountain bikes will share ~~the~~ trails with hikers - I prefer the "every other day" access for bikes on the Rim Trail across 431.

I realize it isn't being addressed right now, but I am opposed to any access by ~~the~~ motorized vehicles in the winter.
