Tongue-in-cheek: was the time chosen so folks get 1.1x or 2x or 3x pay for working on Holiday??? But seriously please have more consideration to burn mid-week non holidays in the future....it was horrible...my family regaled in gas masks for the entire 10 days.. of course we did not know the weather attributes however post-fact it was calm also after the holidays...

2- Shame on the Forest Service for not taking to heart the escape route mitigation from upper 108 residences by clearing the remainder of 108 as was done near Mi Wuk.. why not continue past long barn and cold springs?? The deep clearing past the shoulders could have been done mechanically...indeed a more pressing higher priority need than burning deeper in the forest on some poor-geographical plan into the forest using our citizenry limited funds instead of attending to the urgent- absolute deadly if not cleared- escape route mitigation.

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
